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#### **GIS range of documents**

It was agreed to retain the following as GIS but products associated with these specifications will not require a mandatory Kitemark:

- TED1-3 Holesaws and holesaw taps
- E22 Vehicle mounted leakage survey equipment
- E49 PE pipe coil trailers
- E5 Pipe cutting wheels
- EL/8 Gas Holder Modular Antifreeze equipment

EL19 Electrical loan appliances will be removed as a GIS.

#### **Documents modifications approved for publication**

V4. Service isolation valves up to 50mm operating up to 2bar

#### **Steel pipe and fittings <7bar scopes**

Inconsistency in size ranges. The pipe spec L2 ranges from 21.3mm to 1219mm whilst the fittings spec F7 ranges from 15mm to 450mm.

#### **Other issues discussed**

##### **SBGI meeting**

SBGI members had requested that a distribution list be set up for the dissemination of information, particularly document updates.

It was agreed that this should include the standard Supplier list, BSi, plus named individuals who had specifically requested to be notified.

#### **Should all products should show the kitemark?**

It was agreed that where possible the product should be marked. As an alternative it was acceptable for any product bag to include a label with the approval mark. If neither is practical

the Supplier should flag it up via the BSi route and a decision by BSi/GDNs will be made on a case by case basis.
