The winners will also secure a £5,000 grant for their school to put towards initiatives focused on climate change and science, technology, engineering and mathematics and £150 worth of National Book Tokens or science related toys for themselves.

We are asking primary and secondary school children in years 3-10, aged between 7-15, to submit up to a 200 word entry to the question:

IF YOU WERE IN CHARGE OF THE COUNTRY, WHAT WOULD YOU DO TO HELP LOOK AFTER THE PLANET?"

Responses will be judged based on their originality, creativity, inspiration and passion by a panel of VIP judges.
