

# VIEWPOINT 1 - View from Huttoft Beach, looking south west

## **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of expansive rural agricultural landscape at Huttoft Beach, looking south west. The land is gently undulating, with long views across open countryside. Settlement patterns are dispersed and rural in nature, with little urban intrusion. The foreground is dominated by low, dense scrub. The mid-ground comprises fields bounded by low hedgerows and sparse tree cover. In the distance, scattered farm buildings and a few small woodland blocks are visible, with a notable white gable-fronted building.

# VIEWPOINT 2 - View from Huttoft Beach, looking south BASELINE PANORAMA



## **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of a relatively broad and open landscape which is coastal in nature, with beach presence and featuring sand dunes. The landscape features key components including sand dunes, heather, beach and water (sea). Views of the wider landscape in the near distance is defined by sand/beach, progressing to sand dunes in the middle distance, which slope upwards to the far distance of the view, which is defined by mature shrub (heather) vegetation. The skyline is the view is largely vegetated and unbroken, with a horizon of the mature vegetation.




## **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Thurlby. The view is representative of landscape which is generally open and gently rolling with some established blocks of vegetation and trees. The land use is agricultural land use, rural in character and there is presence of OHLs and wind farm infrastructure. Some single residential properties are present.




## **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Cumberworth Ings. The viewpoint is representative of a view of an agricultural landscape, facing across flat to gently undulating terrain. The landscape is predominantly rural and agricultural in nature, characterized by large, open fields with improved grassland and hedgerows or intermittent tree lines along some field boundaries. The landform is broadly flat with a very gentle slope, contributing to wide visibility across the scene. The vegetation comprises managed grassland and scattered trees along field boundaries. Some areas of taller vegetation and shrubbery appear on the margins. The area appears to be part of a pastoral landscape with grazing land visible in the middle to far distance, interspersed with occasional trees and small clusters of woodland. There is very limited built development visible in this view. The skyline is formed largely by distant tree lines and low hills.




## **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Bonthorpe. The view is representative of landscape which is generally open and flat with agricultural field, with presence of mature hedgerow which line the field boundary of Cumberworth rd (to the left most portion of the view), trees and vegetation in the near distance. In the middle distance the land-scape is flat and there is presence of mature vegetation including shrub and hedgerow which regularly feature across the middle distance.




## **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Willoughby. The viewpoint is representative of a wide, open view across an arable agricultural landscape, looking across cultivated land with distant tree belts and hedgerows along the horizon. The landscape is rural and intensively managed for agriculture. The land use is predominantly arable. The terrain is flat to very gently undulating, offering expansive views in all directions. Vegetation cover is sparse within the immediate foreground and midground. Field boundaries in the far distance are defined by occasional hedgerows and small woodland blocks, contributing to a sense of enclosure on the horizon. No significant built development or infrastructure is visible in this view. The skyline is broad and uninterrupted, formed entirely by distant trees and hedgerows.

# **VIEWPOINT 9 - View from Welton le Marsh, looking south**

## **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Welton le Marsh. The viewpoint is representative of a wide, open field with sparse vegetation. The foreground consists of the open field with sparse vegetation. The middleground features the continuation of the field, extending towards the horizon. This section includes the utility poles and overhead wires that traverse the field. The background is marked by a line of mature trees along the horizon. These trees create a natural boundary and provide depth to the landscape. The horizon is marked by a line of mature trees, providing a natural boundary to the landscape. Utility poles and overhead wires traverse the field.




# **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Candlesby (Lincolnshire Wolds National Landscape). The viewpoint is representative of a view of an agricultural landscape, from the Lincolnshire Wolds National Landscape, looking south east facing across flat terrain. The landscape is rural and agricultural in nature, characterized by large, open fields with sparse vegetation. The landform is broadly flat, contributing to wide visibility across the scene. The horizon is marked by a line of mature trees, providing a natural boundary to the landscape. There is very limited built development visible in this view.

# **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Candlesby (Lincolnshire Wolds National Landscape). This viewpoint is representative of a a landscape which is predominantly rural and agricultural in nature, featuring a rural road junction where the A158 meets a roundabout near Gunby Hall. The vegetation in the view comprises managed grassland and scattered trees along the field bounda-ries. Dense hedgerows and brambles grow alongside the pathways, providing natural borders. To the east a large tree canopy extends overhead. The center of the image is dominated by a large field. A continuous line of trees and hedgerows encloses the field. The horizon remains low and open, emphasizing the flat terrain. The view also features road infrastructure which is bordered by grassy verges.



# **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Orby. This viewpoint represents a rural setting with open fields which are tree-lined, and distant farm structures. The landscape is predominantly agricultural, with patches of green grass and vegetation along the edges of the field in the middleground. The background features clusters of trees and some buildings visible in the distance. There is very limited built development visible in this view. The skyline is formed largely by distant tree lines. To the west, a wooded path curves into the scene, partially enclosed by tall trees and dense undergrowth. To the east, a grassy farm track runs parallel to the field, bordered by hedgerows and small shrubs. The center features an open field with subtle undulations. A dense tree line encloses the horizon, with varied tree heights and density.






# **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Great Steeping. This viewpoint showcases expansive farmland with a mix of cultivated land, rural housing, and infrastructure. To the west, open agricultural fields extend towards the horizon, separated by hedgerows and a tree line, with occasional buildigs in the distance. To the east, residential properties are visible. Utility poles and power lines add vertical elements. Scattered trees and hedgerows partially obscure the far view. The horizon is lined with mature trees and bushes, creating a natural boundary. In the background, some buildings and power lines can be seen, introducing elements of infrastructure into the otherwise rural setting. The skyline is formed largely by distant tree lines and the tops of buildings and power lines.




# **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Firsby. This viewpoint showcases predominantly agricultural land with open arable fields and a rural road network. The terrain is flat with slight undulations, defined by hedgerows and scattered trees. Shrubs and grasses line road edges and drainage ditches. To the west, a narrow rural lane runs alongside residential properties, bordered by grass verges and a trimmed hedge. Expansive fields dominate, with a horizon of open fields and distant tree belts. In the center, grassy field margins transition into cultivated farmland, with a drainage ditch bordered by overgrown vegetation. Trees and hedgerows add height variation, with distant woodland and small farm buildings visible. To the east, a road curves gently, flanked by hedgerows and trees. Residential properties with red brick facades and pitched roofs line the edge are present in the view. Small clusters of trees partially obscure distant farmland, with scattered buildings visible. The presence of power lines add vertical elements and presence of infrastructure.

# VIEWPOINT 17 - View from Ings Lane, Little Steeping, looking west



# **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Little Steeping. This viewpoint highlights predominantly agricultural land with open arable fields and rural roads. The terrain is flat with subtle undulations, defined by hedgerows and scattered trees. Overgrown grass and low shrubs line ditches. To the west, a minor road runs alongside a grassy field margin with mixed vegetation and a cluster of trees, partially obscuring a small building. Distant tree belts and occasional buildings break up the horizon. In the center, a wooden fence marks a well-maintained pasture with open grazing fields, occasional hedgerows, and trees. The horizon features scattered farmsteads and wooded areas. To the east, the view transitions from pasture to cultivated farmland, with lower vegetation allowing an open view. Field boundaries are defined by hedgerows, with arable fields contrasting to the pasture. The landscape continues as open farmland with intermittent tree clusters.



This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Little Steeping. This viewpoint is representative of land use which is predominantly agricultural, featuring a combination of pasture and arable fields. Topography is gently undulating but largely flat. Vegetation includes grassy field margins and hedgerows along the fence line with scattered trees and shrubs, particularly along the western side. Along the horizon there are groups of trees with presence of hedgeows and occasional farmsteads.



# **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from New Leake. The viewpoint is representative of a view of a rural landscape, characterized by a wide, flat terrain with road presence and vast green fields extending to the horizon. This viewpoint highlights predominantly agricultural land with large arable fields and flat topography. To the west, a hedgerow with trees lines the road, providing enclosure. The hedgerow continues with taller trees, creating a varied skyline, then diminishes, allowing expansive rural views. In the center, the road extends into the distance, bordered by narrow verges and a shallow drainage ditch. The horizon remains open, with distant tree belts and agricultural infrastructure faintly visible. There is very limited built development visible in this view, maintaining the rural character of the scene.




# **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Midville. This viewpoint highlights predominantly agricultural land with large arable fields and dispersed residential properties. The flat terrain offers wide, open views. Vegetation includes low hedgerows and occasional trees, with mixed grasses and shrubs along roadsides. To the west, a bridge crosses a drainage channel, with a road. Open fields, hedgerows, and scattered farm buildings define the landscape. The horizon features low trees and farm structures. The watercourse runs parallel to the road, with grasses and reeds on the embankment. Utility poles with power lines add vertical elements. The road and drainage channel extend into the distance, with trees and houses visible further away.
















# **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of the open agricultural landscape of Holbeach Marsh, north of Holbeach Clough. It is an open, predominantly arable farmland comprising a very large rectilinear field pattern, separated by open drainage ditches with very little vegetation. Farmsteads and dwellings run in linear fashion along the line of Sluice Road in the middle distance, with isolated farmsteads visible infrequently across the wider landscape in the middle to far distance. Timber poled power lines run parallel with Sluice Road and across open fields in the near and middle distance. The view is far-reaching and uninterrupted across open fields either side of Sluice Road, towards a continuous low skyline defined by distant tree cover.



# **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of the open agricultural landscape looking towards Holbeach Marsh, north of Holbeach. It is an open, predominantly arable farmland comprised of a large rectilinear field pattern, separated mainly by open drainage ditches. Roads are either open along field boundaries. or enclosed by hedges with few trees. Infrequent farm buildings are visible in the wider landscape, in the middle distance and towards a skyline defined by lines of narrow shelterbelt planting, pockets of deciduous woodland and some hedgerows along local field margins.



# **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of the open agricultural landscape between Holbeach Hurn and Holbeach. It is an open, predominantly arable farmland comprised of a large rectilinear field pattern and separated mainly by open drainage ditches. Hurn Bank is bounded by gapped roadside vegetation, which allows for wider reaching views from some residential properties along the lane. A timber poled power line runs alongside the lane in the near distance, and similar power lines cross open fields in the middle distance of view. Infrequent farm buildings are visible in the wider landscape, in the middle distance and towards a skyline defined by narrow shelterbelt planting, pockets of deciduous woodland and roadside hedgerows along local field margins. A low, far distant skyline is evident to the south-west beyond this vegetation.

# VIEWPOINT 40 - View from Hurn Road, Holbeach, looking north east




### **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of the open agricultural landscape to the north-east of Holbeach, looking in the direction of Holbeach Hurn and Fleet Hargate. It is an open, predominantly arable farmland comprised of very large fields separated by open drainage ditches with little vegetation. Hurn Road is characteristic of the local lane network, open in prosepect and with little defining roadside vegetation. A timber poled power line run alongside Hurn Road in the near to middle distance, while similar power lines cross the landscape in the middle distance, against the skyline. Beyond the residential edge of Holbeach, isolated farmsteads and groups of dwellings are visible across the wider landscape, in the middle or far distance, with distant canopies of mature trees which are in the main associated with landholdings. A double row of mature avenue trees is prominent off Woodhouse Lane to the north, connecting with more distant narrow shelterbelt planting on field margins to the north. Woodland belts surrounding Hovenden Golf Club are also evident to the east, combining to largely limit any skyline views beyond.

### View Value

Views are considered to be of Medium value, although aesthetic and perceptual qualities are lowered by the presence of pylons.



### VIEWPOINT 041 - View from Little Marsh Lane, Fleet Hargate, looking south west




### **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of the open agricultural landscape between Holbeach and Fleet Hargate. It is an open, predominantly arable farmland comprised of very large fields separated by open drainage ditches with little vegetation. Little Marsh Lane is characteristic of the local lane network, open in prospect and with little defining roadside vegetation. A middle distant sklyine is defined by mature tree canopies, associated with the residential dwellings of Fleet and Holbeach, and in combination with some remnant, overmature hedge lines within nearby fields. Isolated farmsteads and dwellings are visible across the wider landscape in the middle distance. The spire of the Diocese of Lincoln Saint Mary Magdalene Fleet is visible on the skyline to the south, similarly the spire of All Saints Church at Holbeach forms a distant skyline feature to the west. There is an occasional, far distant skyline of tree cover, with high voltage overhead power lines just visible on the skyline to the south-east, at the limit of the view.

Views are considered to be of Medium value, although aesthetic and perceptual qualities are lowered by the presence of pylons.


# **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of the open agricultural landscape to the south-east of Holbeach, looking eastwards in the direction of Fleet. It is an open, predominantly arable farmland comprised of very large fields separated by open drainage ditches with little vegetation. Hazelwood Lane is characteristic of the local lane network, this being open in prosepect and with little defining roadside vegetation. Timber poled power lines run across and in parallel with the lane, in the near to middle distance.

Infrequent, isolated farmsteads and dwellings are visible across the wider landscape in the middle to far distance. The spire of the Diocese of Lincoln Saint Mary Magdalene Fleet denotes the village location of Fleet, visible above the canopy of mature trees associated with the residential extents of the village. A far distant skyline defined by tree cover is present across a wide field of view, punctuated in the middle distance by blocks of plantation woodland and mature boundary vegetation associated with Fleet. Overhead power lines punctuate the skyline to the south-east, at the limit of the view.




# **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of the open agricultural landscape at Fleet Fen, looking in the general direction of Fleet. It is an open, predominantly arable farmland comprised of very large fields separated by open drainage ditches with little vegetation. Ben's Gate Road is characteristic of the local lane network, being open in prosepect and with little defining roadside vegetation. Timber poled power lines run in parallel with the road from the near to middle distance.

Infrequent, isolated farmsteads and dwellings are visible across the landscape. A far distant skyline defined by tree cover is present across a wide field of view, punctuated in the middle distance by blocks of plantation woodland and mature boundary vegetation associated with properties. Overhead power lines punctuate the skyline to the south-east, at the limit of the view.

Views are considered to be of Medium value, although aesthetic and perceptual qualities are lowered by the presence of pylons.




# **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of the open agricultural landscape at Gedney Fen, looking northwards in the general direction of Gedney Broadgate and Fleet. It is an open, predominantly arable farmland comprised of very large fields, separated by open drainage ditches with little vegetation.

Infrequent, isolated farmsteads and dwellings are visible across the landscape, with vegetation limited to that associated with properties and occasional stands of plantation woodland. Roadside vegetation is sparse. An unbroken and far distant skyline of tree cover is evident across a wide field view.

# **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is broadly representative of views experienced by residential and recreational receptors in the open agricultural landscape between Old Gate and Foreman's Bridge. It is an open, mixed arable / pastoral farmland comprised of very large fields, separated by open drainage ditches.


There are wide and far-reaching views across the landscape, with vegetation predominantly limited to roadside hedgerows with mature trees and more distant, isolated stands of plantation woodland.

Timber poled power lines run in parallel across open fields in the near to middle distance of view. Overhead power lines punctuate the skyline in the far distance.

# **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of views experienced from the northern residential fringe of Tydd St. Mary. It is an open and predominantly arable farmland comprised of medium and large rectilinear fields, separated by open drainage ditches with infrequent vegetation. Timber poled roadside power lines cross the landscape in the near distance of the view. The middle distance is punctuated by isolated farmsteads and dwellings with associated pockets of mature tree cover, while rural lanes are evidenced by often outgrown and gapped hedgerows. Fragmented and wide reaching views extend beyond this vegetation towards a far distant skyline of varying tree cover. Overhead power lines are visible on the far skyline to the west, and are partially visible on the skyline to the east.

### **View Value**

Views are considered to be of Medium value, although aesthetic and perceptual qualities are lowered by the presence of pylons to the west of Tydd St. Mary

# VIEWPOINT 47 - View from Common Way, Tydd St Mary, looking north west

### **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of views experienced from the northern and eastern residential fringe of Tydd St. Mary. It is an open and predominantly arable farmland comprising large rectilinear fields separated by open drainage ditches with infrequent vegetation. Common Way defines the village edge in the near distance, open to adjacent fields at the viewpoint although enclosed by roadside vegetation to the west. The middle distance is open, punctuated by occasional farmsteads and dwellings and framed by associated pockets of mature tree cover. Continuous vegetation defining some ditch courses, along with outgrown and heavily gapped hedgerow vegetation alongside the A1101 Wisbech Road. There are far reaching views far towards a distant skyline of varied tree cover, with isolated wind turbines visible against the skyline to the north and east.


The viewpoint is representative of views experienced from the eastern fringe of Tydd Gote, in the direction of Sutton Bridge. It is a predominantly open, arable farmland of large rectilinear fields bordering the River Nene, North Level Main Drain and South Holland Drain channels. The residential fringes of Tydd Gote and Foul Anchor are visible in the near distance of view along with associated tree cover and garden boundary vegetation. There are infrequent managed hedgerows along field boundaries, linking small stands of tree cover at some field junctions. Wind turbines and a communication mast near The Grange Wind Farm are prominent in the middle distance, their connections to ground level either visible or partially screened by hedgerows. There are views beyond the turbines and field boundary vegetation towards a distant skyline of mature tree cover.



The viewpoint is representative of views experienced from the eastern fringe of Tydd Gote, in the direction of Sutton Bridge. It is a predominantly open, arable farmland of large rectilinear fields bordering the River Nene, North Level Main Drain and South Holland Drain channels. The residential fringes of Tydd Gote and Foul Anchor are visible in the near distance of view along with associated tree cover and garden boundary vegetation. There are infrequent managed hedgerows along field boundaries, linking small stands of tree cover at some field junctions. Wind turbines and a communication mast near The Grange Wind Farm are prominent in the middle distance, their connections to ground level either visible or partially screened by hedgerows. 

The foreground features an open grassy field in the center of the view. On the left side, there is a road along the field boundary. The middleground includes the continuation of the grassy field and the road on the left side, with presence of overhead power lines running across the middle portion of the view. Occasional groups of trees also feature across the middleground of the view The background consists of consistent groups of trees and vegetation and also presence of transmission towers.




# **Visual Baseline Description**

The viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Newton. The viewpoint is representative of a rural setting comprised of agricultural field which is flat, open, wide and expansive. The foreground and middleground features an open grassy field. The overall landscape is rural and open field with a well vegetated backdrop. To the easternmost portion of the view there is a group of mature trees which provides screening and a sense of enclosure within this open landscape. The background consists of lines of trees in groups, providing screening and a sense of enclosure and division in the landscape.

The middleground extends the view of the grassy track which forms the Nene Way. The river continues to run parallel to the field. The middle ground includes some trees and vegetation. The background of the view is comprised of electricity transmission towers which consistently feature across the background of the view, and presence of trees and vegetation which creates partial screening along the horizon from the transmission towers. To the westernmost portion of the view in the background wind turbines are visible and are partially screened by intervening vegetation.




# **Visual Baseline Description**

The overall view is of a rural setting comprised of agricultural field which is flat, open, wide and expansive. The overall landscape is rural and open field with a well vegetated background. To the easternmost portion of the view there is a group of mature trees which provides screening from tranmission towers and a sense of enclosure within this open landscape. Transmission towers feature across the middleground of this view and are only patially screened to the westernmost portion of the view. The transmission towers and associated power lines are fully visible across the middleground (central and easternmost) portion of the view. A single wind turbine features within the westernmost portion of this view. The backfround of the view is comprised of consistent begetation which provides some screening elements into the view.




# **Visual Baseline Description**

A minor road/track is present in the central portion of the view and extends through the view, dividing the agricultural fields. Transmission towers and associated power lines feature across the view from foreground through to background and are a key feature of the view. The middleground of the view features two properties which are prominent in the view. The background of the view is comprised of consistent trees and vegetation which provides some screening elements into the view.




# **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Ingleborough. This viewpoint exhibits a broad, open agricultural landscape characterised by a gently rolling field extending across the foreground and middleground. The land is primarily flat with a slight gradient. In the background, a line of mature trees and scattered farm buildings, including barns and utility structures, define the horizon and suggest a rural settlement. A single large agricultural building is centrally visible, providing a focal point within the otherwise open and expansive field.


## **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from West Walton. This viewpoint presents a predominantly rural landscape, looking across a large, open expanse of agricultural land under cultivation. The landscape is flat and expansive, with an open character and extensive visibility toward the horizon. The land use is agricultural, with a few built structures visible along the field boundary.

In the foreground there is presence of a narrow strip of roadside verge bordered by grass and low hedgerow vegetation, giving way to a wide, ploughed field that dominates the middle and background. To the left of the image there is presence of mature trees and a fenced boundary. Poles and overhead wires follow the line of the road. Overall, this viewpoint exhibits a rural environment with open and strong agricultural character.

## **Visual Baseline Description**

This viewpoint is representative of views experienced from Walpole St Peter. This viewpoint looks across a broad, flat agricultural landscape. The field is bounded by a shallow grassed embankment in the immediate foreground. The landscape is open and expansive, offering longdistance views across the flat terrain toward the horizon. A prominent feature of this view is the alignment of large overhead electricity pylons and transmission lines that traverse the scene from left to right. While the land use is strongly agricultural and the setting remains rural in character, the presence of the overhead transmission infrastructure introduces a notable visual element. In the far distance, a thin belt of trees and low-built structures mark the edge of a small settlement.

Views are considered to be of Medium value, although aesthetic and perceptual qualities are lowered by the presence of electricity transmission towers and associated lines.





The middle ground of the view is dominated by electrical transmission towers with multiple power lines extending horizontally across the sky. The transmission towers in the middle of the image are prominent man-made structures supporting multiple power lines extending horizontally across the view. Groups of trees and vegetation are consistently present across the backgorund of the view on the horizon line, with presence of transmission towers.



The trees and vegetation on both sides of the road provide a sense of enclosure. The middle ground extends beyond the immediate roadside trees and bushes. It includes more of the road as it stretches into the distance, flanked by additional trees and vegetation.
