Community Helpline 0800 279 3408 In March 2023 Friends of Portbury Nature Reserve was awarded £20,000 to support the creation and installation of a permanent but seasonally changeable Wetlands Trail at Portbury Wharf Nature Reserve.

The project involved installing 12 A2 lecterns with wildlife panels displaying winter (from October) and summer panels (from April). Each panel has a number of interchangeable interactive elements such as quizzes, facts and things to look out for.

It also developed a metal Wilbur water vole trail for visitors to the reserve to find and a bug house to encourage biodiversity.

To additionally support trail the project created a flyer, updated the nature reserve map and produced a digital trail available to download from the dedicated Wetlands Trail webpage (<u>https://www.portburywharfnaturer</u> <u>eserve.co.uk/wetlands-trail/</u>). The creation of the Wetlands Trail has raised the profile of the Friends of Portbury Wharf within existing partners as well as to the general public, with more people signing up to the mailing list.
