5B.1 Introduction

- 5B.1.1 This appendix presents the detailed preliminary summary of non-significant effects on heritage assets identified as a result of construction and/or operational activities within the Study Area for Section 4 New Lincolnshire Connection Substation B to Refined Weston Marsh Substation Siting Zone (Section 4) of the Project.
- 5B.1.2 A number of designated heritage assets, which may experience non-significant effects, have been identified as warranting further explanation of their assessment due to particular sensitivities, such as their high value, designed views, historic setting or their proximity to works proposed within the draft Order Limits. - 5B.1.3 It should be noted that the assessment which has informed the conclusions presented remains ongoing and is subject to change, due to the ongoing survey activities and further design development of the Project.
