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4A. Bird Survey Data 2024

4A.1 Introduction

- 4A.1.1 This appendix presents the breeding bird survey data available to inform the preliminary assessment reported in the Preliminary Environmental Information (PEI) Report for Section 7 New Walpole B Substation (Section 7) of the Project. This survey data was collected from surveys in 2024. Data presented shows the abundance and conservation status of species recorded for breeding birds.
- 4A.1.2 No survey data were available for wintering birds in Section 7, however, further avian work was undertaken during winter 2024/25 and the full survey results will be presented and assessed within the ES
- 4A.1.3 Further details of the survey methodologies adopted are provided in PEI Report Volume 3 Part A Appendix 4B Environmental Impact Assessment Methodologies and Scope.

Breeding Birds

- 4A.1.4 Breeding bird survey data is presented, as collected from surveys from in 2024. Data presented show the number of territories within surveyed areas, as well as the conservation status of species recorded.
- 4A.1.5 It should be noted that the survey transect for breeding birds only had partial coverage of the area and thus the number of territories does not represent the total number of birds breeding or using this area in the breeding season.
- 4A.1.6 Further avian work will be required in 2025 for breeding birds and the full survey results will be presented and assessed in the Environmental Statement (ES).
