

Willesden and Kensal Green Connection project: Community Update

Dear Neighbour,

Welcome to the latest newsletter for the Willesden and Kensal Green Connection project.

The project will provide a new connection for a data centre in the Park Royal area near to the Grand Union Canal, between our substations at Willesden and Kensal Green. This involves replacing cables along the Grand Union Canal towpath, using the existing high voltage cable troughs.

Since our last update we have **successfully completed phase one of the works**, which involved the removal of the existing cable. We are now entering phase two, which will see the installation of the new replacement cable.

In this edition, we'll share an update on the progress so far, highlight our community engagement activities, and look ahead to the key milestones planned for the rest of the year.

Entering phase two

With the first phase successfully completed in May 2025, we are now gearing up for the second phase of the project. Starting in July 2025 and scheduled to complete by winter 2025, this phase will see the installation of new link boxes, fibre cables, and joint bays along the canal towpath. Our team will also be planting new hedgerows, adding a touch of greenery to the area.

Sections of the towpath will need to be closed during the second phase of works to enable our engineers to work safely and efficiently along the canal. During works, there will be no end-to-end access along the towpath, meaning pedestrians and cyclists will need to follow diversion routes.

Whilst pontoons were installed for the works that took place during phase one, this is not viable during the second phase of works. The installation of new cables is a 'rolling process' rather than static, which means that lengthy sections of the Grand Union Canal towpath need to be closed to enable cable installation.

We appreciate your cooperation as we work to complete the project. We understand that the upcoming works may cause inconvenience and are committed to minimising disturbance where we can.

As part of phase two, there will be three separate diversions. These will be carefully implemented in stages to ensure they do not overlap.

Maps outlining the three diversion routes can be found below.



Timeline of diversions

Scrubs Lane to Ladbroke Grove Road (Monday 14 July - Sunday 3 August 2025)



Old Oak Lane to Scrubs Lane (Monday 4 August - Sunday 5 October 2025)



Step-free access from Ladbroke Grove to Old Oak Lane (Monday 14 July -Sunday 5 October 2025)

Please note, there will be no step-free access between Scrub Lane and the towpath from Monday 14 July to Sunday 5 October. If you require step-free access between Old Oak Lane and Ladbroke Grove Road during this period, please see the additional diversion route.

Weekend night works

To complete our cable installation works in the most efficient way, we will need to undertake limited night work. This work will be carried out over two weekends, outside of regular working hours. This approach allows us to finish the works as quickly as possible and reduce the duration of the towpath closures, minimising disruption for the local community.
