4A. Bird Survey Data 2022-24

4A.1 Introduction

- 4A.1.1 This appendix presents the wintering (2022/2023) and breeding bird (2024) survey data available to inform the preliminary assessment reported in the **Supplementary Preliminary Environmental Information (PEI) Report for Section 5 New Weston Marsh Substations A and B** (Section 5) of the Project. This survey data was collected from surveys from 2022 to 2024. Data presented shows the abundance and conservation status of species recorded for wintering birds and breeding birds.
- 4A.1.2 The information in this appendix reflects that presented within the June 2025 PEI Report Volume 3 Part B Appendix 4A: Bird Survey Data (Ref 1), updated to reflect the draft Order Limits for Section 5.
- 4A.1.3 Further details of the survey methodologies adopted are provided in **Supplementary**PEI Report Volume 3 Part A Appendix 4B Environmental Impact Assessment
 Methodologies and Scope.

Wintering Birds

- 4A.1.4 The abundance data presented for wintering birds are the summed count of all observations of a species across survey visits. This approach may overestimate counts of birds, however the approach does provide a proxy for relative abundance to allow an indicative and precautionary approach to assigning importance.
- 4A.1.5 For abundance, the values presented in parentheses within the following tables represent those records of birds in flight. The 'European Site Features' column identifies whether those species are a qualifying feature, or part of the waterbird assemblage, of European designated sites, noting the consideration of the Impact Risk Zone (IRZ) for the relevant species.
- 4A.1.6 IRZs are a tool development by Natural England to make a rapid initial assessment of potential risks posed by development proposals. They define zones for each feature, outside of which adverse impacts are unlikely.
- 4A.1.7 Further avian work has been undertaken during Winter 2024/25 for wintering birds and the full survey results will be presented and assessed in the Environmental Statement (ES).

Breeding Birds

- 4A.1.8 It should be noted that the survey transect for breeding birds only had partial coverage of the area and thus the number of territories does not represent the total number of birds breeding or using this area in the breeding season.
- 4A.1.9 Breeding bird features of the Ouse Washes are omitted given their IRZ does not overlap with the Section 5 Survey Area.
- 4A.1.10 Further avian work has been undertaken in 2025 for breeding birds and the full survey results will be presented and assessed in the ES.
