

**Consultation and Publicity Statement for
Non-Material Change (NMC-1) Application
in respect of the National Grid (North
London Reinforcement Project) Order 2014**

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1. Introduction

- 1.1 This statement and its appendices constitute the 'Consultation and Publicity Statement' prepared in connection with the non-material change application ('NMC-1 Application') relating to the National Grid (North London Reinforcement Project) Order 2014 submitted by National Grid Electricity Transmission Plc ('NGET') to the Secretary of State on Wednesday 13 May 2026.
- 1.2 Regulations 6 and 7 of the Infrastructure Planning (Changes to, and Revocation of, Development Consent Orders) Regulations 2011 (as amended) (the '2011 Regulations'), set out the requirements for publicising and consulting on an application for a non-material change to a Development Consent Order.
- 1.3 This statement is submitted pursuant to Regulation 7A of the 2011 Regulations and sets out details of the steps taken by NGET to comply with the requirements of Regulations 6 and 7. Regulation 6 relates to publicising the NMC-1 Application and the steps NGET has taken are detailed in section 2 of this statement. Regulation 7 sets out a duty to consult and the steps NGET has taken are detailed in section 3 of this statement.

2. Publicising the Application

- 2.1 NGET confirms compliance with the requirements of Regulation 6 of the 2011 Regulations as follows:
 - 2.1.1 Notice of the NMC-1 Application (the 'Application Notice') has been published in two consecutive weeks in the Enfield and Haringey Independent (being a local newspaper circulating in the vicinity of the land affected by the NMC-1 Application) on 13 May and 20 May 2026. A copy of the Application Notice, and copies of the Application Notice as published in the above newspaper, are provided at Appendix 1.
 - 2.1.2 The Application Notice includes the matters prescribed under Regulation 6(2) of the 2011 Regulations being:
 - a. the name of the applicant - NGET;
 - b. a statement that the applicant is seeking a change which is not material to the National Grid (North London Reinforcement) Order 2014 by way of an application to the Secretary of State – the NMC-1 Application;
 - c. a summary of the main proposals in the NMC-1 Application;
 - d. confirmation that the NMC-1 Application documents can be inspected free of charge on the project page on the Planning Inspectorate website - <https://national-infrastructure-consenting.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/projects/EN020009/documents>;
 - e. a statement that a digital copy of the NMC-1 Application documents can be obtained free of charge and a paper copy can be provided on request;

- f. the latest date on which the NMC-1 Application documents are available for inspection on the Planning Inspectorate website, not being earlier than the deadline for representations in response to the application. A date of 20 June 2026 was specified;
- g. details of how to respond to the NMC- 1 Application; and
- h. the deadline for receipt of those comments by the Secretary of State being a date not less than 28 days following the date on which the notice was last published. A deadline of 19 June 2026 was specified.

3. Duty to Consult

- 3.1 NGET confirms compliance with the requirements of Regulation 7 of the 2011 Regulations.
- 3.2 The period during which representations can be made in relation to the NMC-1 Application began on 13 May 2026 and closed at 23:59 on 19 June 2026. The NMC-1 Application documents were made available on the Project page on the Planning Inspectorate website under the “Documents” tab, from 13 May 2026.
- 3.3 By correspondence dated 10 February and 27 March 2026 the Applicant sought, in accordance with Regulation 7(3) of the 2011 Regulations, the approval of the Secretary of State for a reduced list of consultees, in accordance with Regulation 7(3) of the 2011 Regulations.
- 3.4 On 10 April 2026, the Secretary of State agreed to that request and further directed the Applicant as to those parties to be consulted. A copy of the letter from the Secretary of State agreeing to the list of consultees is attached at Appendix 2 and the full list of approved consultees is provided at Appendix 3.
- 3.5 In compliance with Regulation 7(1) and (2) of the 2011 Regulations, notification letters enclosing a copy of the Application Notice were sent to the full list of consultees approved by the Secretary of State by first class post on 12 May. An example of the letter sent is provided at Appendix 4.
- 3.6 In addition, NGET has affixed five copies of the Application Notice around the boundary of the land at Tottenham substation which is subject to the NMC-1 Application (‘Site Notices’). There are three parcels of unregistered land in the vicinity of Tottenham Substation and the landowners of these three parcels were included in the Regulation 7(3) consultee list approved by the Secretary of State (see Appendix 3). Site Notices were therefore affixed on land with each parcel of unregistered land. Two further Site Notices were affixed to the entrances of Tottenham Substation. These notices were maintained until 19 June 2026, and were checked regularly during this time to ensure they remain visible. Photographs of the erected Site

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that National Grid Electricity Transmission Plc (“**NGET**”) of 1-3 Strand, London, WC2N 5EH is submitting an application (“**the NMC-1 Application**”) to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero under Regulation 4 of the Infrastructure Planning (Changes to, and Revocation of, Development Consent Orders) Regulations 2011 (as amended), seeking changes which are not material to be made to the National Grid (North London Reinforcement Project) Development Consent Order 2014 (“**the 2014 Order**”). The Planning Inspectorate reference number is EN020009.

The 2014 Order authorised NGET to uprate the overhead electricity line (“**OHL**”) running from Waltham Cross substation to Tottenham substation from 275 kilovolts to 400 kilovolts including works to Waltham Cross substation, Brimsdown substation and Tottenham substation, and to carry out all associated works. The DCO was made on 16 April 2014 and came into force on 7 May 2014.

Summary of the Proposals

The NMC-1 Application seeks to facilitate a change to the design of the authorised development set down in Schedule 1 to the 2014 Order. Work No. 10 comprises works to facilitate the bypass of Tottenham substation through the provision of a cabling solution. It is now proposed that the bypass of Tottenham substation be achieved by means of a new section of OHL spanning over the existing substation building. To facilitate this design change, the following changes to the 2014 Order are proposed:

Proposed Change 1: Amendment of the design of transmission pylon VC1R

Transmission pylon VC1R consented under Work No. 11 of the 2014 Order to be increased in height to 62m to allow sufficient safety clearances of the substation.

Proposed Change 2: Installation of a new transmission pylon ZBC44

The installation of a new transmission pylon – ZBC44 – at a height of 61m within the Order Limits and on land owned by NGET.

Proposed Change 3: Installation of two spans of new 400kV overhead line

The installation of two short sections of new 400kV OHL to connect:

- Transmission pylon ZBC43 to new transmission pylon ZBC44 approximately 55m in length; and
- Transmission pylon VC1R to new transmission pylon ZBC44 approximately 260m in length.

Proposed Change 4: Minor extension to the Order Limits

The proposed new section of OHL between new transmission pylon VC1R and the new transmission pylon ZBC44 will span over the southeastern corner of the Tottenham substation building owned by NGET. The Order Limits will be extended to include the part of the substation building over which the proposed new section of OHL will span.

Proposed Change 5: Removal of authorised development relating to underground cable bypass of Tottenham substation

As an OHL bypass of Tottenham substation is now proposed, this change would remove from the authorised development under the 2014 Order any works relating to the underground cable bypass.



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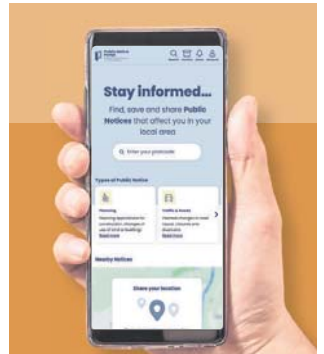

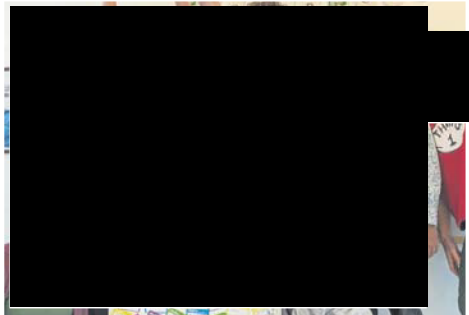
A COMMUNITY group in Tottenham is on a mission to save a public building from being sold by Haringey Council.

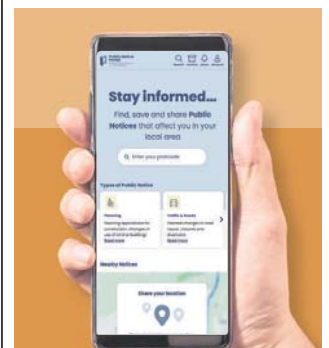

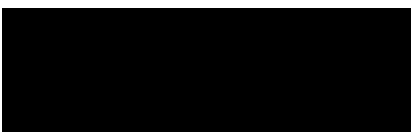
PROPOSED NON-MATERIAL CHANGE APPLICATION

REGULATION 7(3) OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE PLANNING (CHANGES TO, AND REVOCATION OF, DEVELOPMENT CONSENT ORDERS) REGULATIONS 2011 - WRITTEN CONSENT FROM THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR NOT CONSULTING A PERSON OR AUTHORITY

1. Thank you for your email and letter of 10 February 2026 on behalf of National Grid Electricity Transmission Plc (“the Applicant”) regarding the proposed non-material change to the Order. The letter requested the Secretary of State’s consent under Regulation 7(3) of the Infrastructure Planning (Changes to, and Revocation of, Development Consent Orders) Regulations 2011 (as amended) (“the 2011 Regulations”) to a reduced list of consultees.
2. The letter provided a description of the proposed changes, the reasons for the proposed changes, a list of the persons and authorities proposed for inclusion and exclusion for consultation under Regulation 7(2) of the 2011 Regulations, and a list of persons prescribed under Section 56(2)(a) of the Planning Act 2008.
3. The letter provided the following description of the changes sought to facilitate the substitution of the authorised cable bypass at Tottenham Substation within the Order with a new overhead line bypass:
 - *“Proposed Change 1: Enabling the increased height and change in siting of transmission pylon VC1R;*
 - *Proposed Change 2: Enabling the installation of a new transmission pylon ZBC44;*
 - *Proposed Change 3: Enabling the installation of two spans of new 400kV overhead line;*
 - *Proposed Change 4: Minor extension to the Order limits; and,*
 - *Proposed Change 5: Removal from the scope of the authorised development those works to facilitate the underground cable bypass of Tottenham Substation.”*

4. On 27 February 2026 the Secretary of State requested further information to support the Applicant's request for a reduced list of consultees, with further clarification on the information sought provided by email on 13 March 2026. On 30 March 2026 you submitted further information in response to this request comprising two updated tables setting out the parties proposed and not proposed to be consulted.
5. The Applicant proposes to consult 27 parties. The Secretary of State is satisfied that the consultees proposed by the Applicant are appropriate, noting the reasons given in 'Table 1: Parties Proposed to be Consulted' and the nature of the proposed changes. The Secretary of State is also satisfied that it is not necessary for other consultees either identified by the Applicant in 'Table 2: Parties Proposed Not to be Consulted' or from the Order to be included in the reduced consultee list. This is because they are not directly affected, either because the proposed amendments will not affect their interests, or because their interests relate to a different part of the scheme.
6. However, the Secretary of State considers that in addition to the consultees identified, Network Rail and London Wildlife Trust should be consulted as these parties may have representations to make in relation to the proposed changes due to the proximity of the proposed changes to their interests.
7. Accordingly, under Regulation 7(3) of the 2011 Regulations, the Secretary of State consents to the reduced list of consultees as specified in this letter.
8. In taking this decision, the Secretary of State acknowledges that the Applicant will provide notice of the Application in line with the requirements in Regulation 6 of the 2011 Regulations.
9. The Secretary of State's written consent in this matter should not be taken as indicating approval for any other aspects of the proposed changes to the Order which fall to him for consideration and determination, or whether the proposed changes will ultimately be regarded as material or not.

Consultation on a Non-Material Change Application The National Grid (North London Reinforcement Project) Order 2014 The Planning Act 2008 and the Infrastructure Planning (Changes to, and Revocation of, Development Consent Orders) Regulations 2011

1 Non-Material Change Application

- 1.1 We are writing to notify you that National Grid Electricity Transmission Plc (**NGET**) has applied to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero to make non-material changes to the National Grid (North London Reinforcement Project) Order (S.I. 2014 No. 1052) (**the 2014 Order**).
- 1.2 The application is being made under Section 153 of, and Schedule 6 to, the Planning Act 2008. Pursuant to regulation 7 of the Infrastructure Planning (Changes to, and Revocation of, Development Consent Orders) Regulations 2011 (**the 2011 Regulations**), NGET is seeking to consult with you regarding the application.
- 1.3 The 2014 Order, which was made by the (then) Secretary of State for Energy and Climate Change on 16 April 2014 and came into force on 7 May 2014, authorises NGET to uprate the overhead electricity line (**OHL**) running from Waltham Cross substation to Tottenham substation from 275 kilovolts to 400 kilovolts including works to Waltham Cross substation, Brimsdown substation, and Tottenham substation, and to carry out all associated works.

2 Overview of the Non-Material Change Application

- 2.1 After an initial pause in the delivery of the works authorised by the 2014 Order, in 2021 NGET re-commenced works to ensure that the North London Reinforcement Project, which is a crucial component of the Great Grid Upgrade, aimed at enhancing the electricity transmission network in London and the surrounding areas, is delivered effectively and efficiently.
- 2.2 The 2014 Order included approval for works to enable the 400kV uprated OHL to bypass Tottenham substation. The bypass design removed the need for Tottenham substation itself to be upgraded. The works originally proposed involved the installation of a new section of underground cable (see Work No. 10 in Schedule 1 to the 2014 Order).
- 2.3 During the detailed design of the proposed cable bypass, constraints have been identified that have led NGET to conclude that it is preferable for the Tottenham

substation bypass to be delivered by means of a new section of OHL spanning the existing substation building.

- 2.4 To facilitate this design change, changes are now proposed to the 2014 Order to enable the proposed new OHL bypass. In relation to the new design solution, changes are proposed to the design of a transmission pylon consented under the 2014 Order (known as VC1R) and a new transmission pylon (known as ZBC44) is also proposed. Two new sections of 400kV OHL are proposed between these pylons. The 2014 Order Limits are proposed to be extended over a portion of the substation building (owned by NGET) to ensure that the new section of OHL benefits from development consent. Finally, changes are also required to remove the underground cable bypass from the description of the development authorised by the 2014 Order.
- 2.5 NGET is not seeking to secure any new or additional powers to acquire land or interests in land compulsorily and an assessment of change has been undertaken. This has concluded that no materially new or materially different environmental effects are considered to arise from the proposed changes.
- 2.6 None of the changes proposed to the 2014 Order are therefore considered to be material.

3 Consultation

- 3.1 You are being consulted about this non-material change application in accordance with Regulation 7 of the 2011 Regulations and, as required by that provision, a copy of the Regulation 6 application notice that has been published is enclosed with this letter.
- 3.2 The enclosed notice provides further detail as regards the proposed changes to the 2014 Order, including details of where copies of the application documents can be viewed and downloaded. The notice also explains how further information regarding the application can be requested.
